Housing Solutions For Hope

On a fall day in 2016, Stacia Weinhaar had a conversation with a friend. She didn't know it at the time, but it marked a turning point — setting her and husband, Marty, on a path to meeting Scott and Luari Bingham. Three years late, the two couples would co-found Housing Solutions for Hope, the first guild of its kind at Seattle Children's Hoppital.

Back in 2016, Stacia couldn't foresee any of this – she was simply showing up for a friend. He told her about a friend in the neighborhood whose child was gravely ill. Stacia dish't know this family personally, but the story affected her profoundly, in the following weeks, Stacia and Mary inquired about this family every chance they could. They learned the father had to quit his dreamj but he with his son at Seattle Children's, As a result, the family was struggling to make their mortgage payments and now they were in danger of losing their house. Stacia and Marty felt compelled to help.

The Weishaars already supported the hospital's uncompensated care, so Stacia phoned the executive director of the Seattle Children's Guild Association to ask if they could temporarily direct their donation through the guild supporting housing security to help this specific family. The director informed her there was no such guild. The Weishaars were shocked. Here was a hospital with over 300 guilds, but none dedicated to housing assistance. Dismay then turned to determination—if a housing guild dight exist, they'd just have to start one. They got to work, pushing for a solution.

Unbeknownst to the Weishaars at the time, Scott Bingham, Senior Director of IT at Scattle Children's shared a similar vision and was gaining traction. He and his wife, Lauri, who volunteeree at the hospital, had seen the need for housing support firsthand.

Everyone agreed there was a problem, but no one had tackled it. A vision for a guild began to take shape in Scott's mind, so he approached his colleagues in leadership. "I asked, what's preventing us from doing this? And there was no reason," said Scott. "Hi gast hadn't been done before." Through a Master's program at Seattle University, Scott worked to hone his vision into an actionable plar.

In 2018, a mutual acquaintance of the Weishaars and Binghams became aware of their parallel efforts and facilitated a meeting. The four met up at the RAM to discuss their shared vision. "Scott was very prepared," Stacia recalled, "he had developed a business plan for the guild. When he walked us through his Power Point, I got tears in my eyes. Then he started talking about the 'why' of what he was doing and I knew we were in." So the four joined forces.

The "why" was easy to get behind, Many patient families at Seat-lec Children's are in financial distress due to the strain of having a critically ill child, and in most cases, the needs are ongoing. For a patient to be discharged, several things must be in place. There's a checklist with questions such as do you have a refrigerator to store the medicine? In some cases, families can't check those basic boxes." He a stable home environment, there's a greater chance the patient will not relapse and have to return for more treatment, said Scott, "so we want to provide patients with a healthy environment to recover."

Scott's leadership position at the hospital gave him access to the right people at the right time.

He approached the Guild Association Board of Trustees with his vision for the guild, and they agreed it aligned with their values of equity and excellence.

The Binghams and Weishaars officially launched Housing Solutions for Hope in early 2019. With fundraising as its primary focus, the guild works closely with social services and organizations inside Seattle Children's who nominate patient families in greatest need, Guilf funds go toward covering mortgage or rent payments to help bridge families through the critical care period — usually about three months. Housing Solutions for Hope's firs auction in November brought in 1810,000, enabling the guild to



elp more than 20 families in 2019, according to Marty. Things ere rolling, with two big fundraisers lined up for 2020.

Then COVID-19 hit. In April, the team had to make the difficult decision to cancel their summer and fall fundraiser events. Whil the Binghams and Weishaars admit the pandemic has slowed their progress, they remain undeterred as they turn to new and creative ways to reach donors. They've started to plan a no finine auction. Someone they know recently hosted a drive-by birthdy party and requested attendees donate to the guild in lieu of gifts. While they see challenges, they also see a givener purposes the pandemic's ripple effect of rising unemployment means more patient families are on the brink. The "why" still remains, and there's a need for hope — now more than ever.

The Housing Solutions for Hope Guild covers housing needs (such as short-term rent or mortgage assistance) for patient families at Seattle Children's. Guild co-founder and president Scott Bingham says that after choosing 2020 dates for the guild's events and then having to postpone the golf tournament and auction as a result of COVID-19, members decided the best way to support each other would be to quickly regroup and plan 2021 dates and kick off a light social media campaign. The guild members then decided to take the summer off and regroup in the fall.

"We have a lot of young families and volunteers involved in our guild – some are job hunting or juggling working and caring for children through the pandemic," he says. "We share compassion and understanding around where they are and we're trying not to put too much extra on their plates."

It speaks to his guild's resiliency that they have committed to come back together this fall to plan for their next event in February.

"Now with something set on the horizon we can move forward at a realistic pace," Bingham says. "We didn't just hit the wall and stop, we got our next event on the calendar and are working toward it."
